

JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANTS (JAG) AWARDS 2020

AGENCY	AWARD AMOUNT	PURPOSE
Barren River Drug Task Force	\$106,430	The Barren River Drug Task Force will continue to work with other Federal, State, and Local law enforcement agencies throughout the grant period to properly utilize grant funding to reduce the illegal drug activities in the Barren River area. The DTF will continue to attempt to identify illegal drug traffickers, transporters, distributors and manufacturers or will help in assisting other agencies to do the same by either sharing information or working collaboratively with other federal, state or local law enforcement agencies.
Bowling Green – Warren County Drug Task Force	\$141,586	The Bowling Green – Warren County Drug Task Force is committed to the suppression of illegal drugs and narcotics. The Drug Task Force, through the combined efforts of local, state and federal agencies, will actively pursue those groups or individuals who manufacture, distribute or sell illegal drugs within the jurisdictional boundaries of Warren County. The Drug Task Force will function as an extension of all law enforcement agencies within Warren County.
City of Raceland/FADE Task Force	\$134,757	FADE Task Force was founded by local law enforcement agencies in 1988, with an inter-local agreement, to combat drug trafficking organizations not limited by jurisdictional boundaries. All detectives work a 40-hour week to make drug buys, interview confidential informants, make court appearances, write cases, arrests and investigate any information on drug activity reported to the task force.
Erlanger Police Department	\$34,565	This is the second phase of a two-phase project to replace and update the video monitoring and recording systems of the Department. In this phase of the project, the Department will replace the entire video monitoring and recording system in all remaining areas of the Erlanger Police and City Government Campus, in order to assure and provide much-needed security.

Greater Hardin County Narcotics Task Force	\$183,321	This project will fund the positions of Director and Administrative Assistant to provide management and clerical work and data entry for the GHCNTF. The task force consists of 12 detectives whose responsibility will be to target, investigate, arrest and seek prosecution against individuals who are trafficking in, manufacturing or cultivating illegal controlled substances or who divert prescription pharmaceutical drugs for illegal purposes. The agents will work primarily a five county area comprised of Hardin, Hart, Nelson, Grayson and Larue counties and assist in other surrounding counties as requested.
Greenville Police Department	\$8,992	Award funds will be used to purchase eight (8) Tasers and accessories to replace dated equipment.
HCSO/Bluegrass Narcotic's Task Force	\$50,000	Federal, state and local law enforcement agencies in Bourbon and Harrison County created the Bluegrass Narcotic's Task Force (BNTF). The agencies work together in a combined effort to reduce to influx of heroin, fentanyl, and other dangerous drugs in Bourbon and Harrison County. Agencies focus on individuals or groups selling and/or travelling out of state to obtain these drugs. JAG funding supports supplies and personnel necessary to support the work of the task force.
Lake Cumberland Area Drug Task Force	\$141,586	The Lake Cumberland Area Drug Task Force, a multi-jurisdictional/multi-agency collaboration, addresses Drug Trafficking Organizations and street level traffickers involved in the manufacturing/distribution of methamphetamine and other illicit drugs, including the diversion of prescription of drugs and Heroin. The task force's area of responsibility included Wayne (Monticello), Pulaski (Somerset) and McCreary Counties.
Lakeside Park – Crestview Hills	\$56,841	This grant project seeks to fund the initial purchase of twelve (12) body cameras with associated software management (Phase I) and 11 integrated in-car video systems (Phase II). Each sworn officer would have an assigned body camera. Each vehicle

		assigned to a patrol capacity would be equipped with an in-car camera.
Lexington Fayette Urban County Government	\$80,000	This award will fund the Street Sales Task Force which includes members from the Lexington Police, DEA Task Force Members and the Commonwealth's Attorney Office. The task force members will work together on a daily/weekly basis to complete the project goal - to continue a strong multi-agency cooperation in the arrest and prosecution of drug offenders.
Northern Kentucky Drug Strike Task Force	\$137,791	<p>The Northern Kentucky Drug Strike Force (NKDSF) is a drug task force responsible for the investigation of drug abuse, drug distribution and related offenses in Boone, Campbell and Kenton counties.</p> <p>The goal of the Task Force is to continue to minimize the adverse effects of drug trafficking on the lives of Northern Kentuckians and their communities through aggressive drug trafficking enforcement, educational programs, harm minimization through prescription drug disposal, and building and maintaining effective partnerships with local, state and federal law enforcement agencies throughout the region.</p>
Pennyriple Narcotics Task Force	\$260,468	<p>The goal of the Pennyriple Narcotics Task Force (PNTF) is to develop leads and gather information to combat the sale, distribution and transportation of illegal drugs and narcotics within the Pennyriple Area Development District, resulting in the arrest and conviction of the person(s) participating in these illegal activities.</p> <p>PNTF will also provide educational programs, as requested, to churches, schools, civic organizations etc. and participate with County Coalitions and KY ASAP to promote anti-drug campaigns and community awareness.</p>
South Central Kentucky Drug Task Force	\$107,439	The goal of the South Central Kentucky Drug Task Force is to enhance the ability of criminal justice agencies to stop drug trafficking, investigate, arrest, prosecute, and convict. The task force will jointly

		coordinate multi-jurisdictional enforcement strategies and educate the public.
