

Section III: Reported Crime Trends

The data in this section includes information gathered from the Kentucky State Police as well as the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS). **In 2011 the information gathered changed from the previously collected Part One and Part Two offenses that were a part of the FBI's Uniform Crime Reports to Group A and Group B offenses that make up part of the FBI's NIBRS database. For this reason, it is not possible to compare reports from previous years to the 2011 data.** Information about the Part One and Part Two crimes as well as those that make up the Group A and Group B offenses is available in Appendix B.

Although law enforcement agencies collect and maintain data on both arrests and offenses reported to the police, researchers generally agree that reported offenses provide a better measure of crime since these reports usually occur closer in time to the actual incidents. While arrests also provide a measure of law enforcement activity, arrests may not be made in all cases and arrests may also reflect specialized enforcement efforts rather than an actual increase in the incidence of crime. In reviewing data on the crime trends, it is important to note the type of data presented along with the inherent limitations of that data.

For example, if an individual is arrested for burglary and there are three counts, KSP will indicate three arrests for that one incident.
