

Section IV: Arrest Trends

This section presents information on arrest trends in the Commonwealth as reported by the Kentucky State Police. It is important to note that KSP calculates arrest data based on the counts associated with an arrest. For example, if an individual is arrested for burglary and there are three counts, KSP will indicate three arrests for that one incident.
